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Former Ben Franklin Institute campus in South End now being pitched as apartments

The latest, revised plans for the redevelopment of the former Benjamin Franklin Institute of Technology (BFIT) campus in the South End now propose apartments, instead of senior housing.

Continuum Development is currently pitching a project for 41 Berkeley St. comprising three components, including the Tremont Component which includes approximately 234 residential units and approximately 6,130 square feet of retail/restaurant space; the Franklin Union Component, which includes approximately 57 residential units and approximately 2,120 square

feet of retail/restaurant space; and the Appleton Component, which includes approximately 21 residential units. Also, 93 parking spaces will be located in a below-grade garage – a substantial increase from the 60 below-grade spaces proposed in the earlier project iteration.

Permitting is on target by the end of next year or early '28, and construction is then expected to take between 24 and 30 months to complete, said Patrick Lee, owner of Continuum and a South End resident, during a Sept. 14 city-sponsored virtual meeting on the Notice of Project Change (NPC) filed last month.

EDITORIAL

DATA CENTERS: WE HAVE MET THE ENEMY AND THEY ARE US

The massive build-out of data centers recently has aroused the wrath of the American public across the political spectrum. However, this backlash has highlighted a sharp disconnect in modern society: On the one hand, we expect technology to provide us with an on-demand, 21st-century digital lifestyle, but on the other, we eschew the infrastructure required to provide us with the means to implement our way of life.

The enormous scale of the newest data centers is difficult to comprehend. The largest data center for Meta (Facebook) in Oregon presently comprises 4.6 million square feet across 11 connected buildings.

But that is nothing compared to Meta's new center in Louisiana that will cover 3,650 acres (about six square miles), a footprint that is almost four times the size of New York City's Central Park.

The environmental impact of data centers is significant: They require huge amounts of water for cooling; most have their own generators that rely either on their own natural gas turbines or the electric grid (often with diesel generators for back-up) that contribute to air pollution; and the industrial cooling systems and rooftop fans create a constant level of noise.

However, using Meta as an example, hundreds of millions of Americans use Meta's platforms -- Facebook, Instagram, Messenger, and WhatsApp -- not merely daily, but on a constant basis, 24/7.

Americans also rely on the other companies with huge data centers, most notably Amazon for our shopping and Alphabet (which owns Google and YouTube) for our information and entertainment.

To be sure, the trillion-dollar tech firms building these data centers must be required to do more to reduce their impact on local communities and the environment.

But in the end, we have to admit a basic truth: Data centers exist because of our insatiable need and desire to click...click.. click...

No general contractor has been selected yet for the project, however, said Lee, so this timeline is still somewhat tentative.

In 2022, local developer Related Beal had proposed a project for the site comprising three separate components: an approximately 210,000 square-foot, 193-unit senior care facility to be operated by a national provider, Atria Senior Living, Inc., with ground-floor retail and accessory uses; the adaptive reuse of the Franklin Union building for residential purposes, including ground-floor retail and accessory uses; and an affordable residential building of approximately 20,000 square feet, with a 4,500 square-foot community space on its ground floor.

Via the latest proposal, the use of the Tremont Component is changed to residential from senior care, while the Franklin Union Building and the Appleton Component will remain residential, said Mitchell Bush, a principal at CBT Architects, during the Sept. 14 virtual meeting.

The project's massing and height (i.e. 110 feet maximum allowable for the Tremont Component; 90 feet maximum

allowable for the Franklin Union Component; and 50 feet maximum allowable for the Appleton Component) will stay the same, said Bush, while 24 percent of the site will be dedicated as open space, which includes the creation of a new courtyard and passageway.

The project also still proposes the preservation of the Franklin Union Building, along with the restoration of the façade of 4 Appleton St., said Bush.

Meanwhile, efforts are now underway to preserve a pair of murals painted on canvas now mounted to the lobby walls of the historic Franklin building at 41 Berkley St..

Kevin Hepner, the college's CFO, said about five years, BFIT had commissioned a study, which determined the best method for preserving the murals entails removing the pieces from the wall, stretching them out on wood frames, and then displaying them as standalone works of art.

"We're finding it difficult to find a home for them," lamented Hepner, however.

In the meeting chat, Stephen Fox, a South End resident who

served on the city's original Impact Advisory Group (IAG) for the project, suggested that the new, soon-to-open South End Branch Library would be a very suitable permanent home for the murals. He added that he believes the Copley Branch of the Boston Public Library would likely be able to house the murals in the meantime.

Hepner enthusiastically embraced Fox's suggestion and said he would follow up on the idea with the BPL. He added the college is working with the developer to preserve as many interior artifacts as possible and said that the Museum of Fine Arts has already purchased one painting for preservation.

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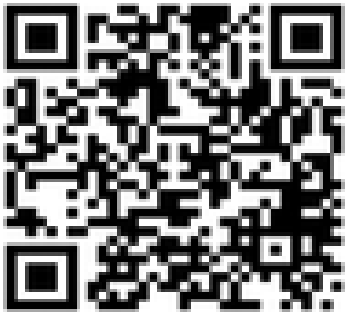

Sen. Brownsberger wins reelection by 37 votes after recount

After a recount completed Thursday, Sept. 10, at City Hall, Sen. William Brownsberger won his reelection bid by 35 votes of more than 24,000 ballots cast. The incumbent beat out Dan-

iel Lander, a former senior policy advisor to Mayor Michelle Wu who received her support in the race, by a narrow margin in the Sept. 1 Democratic primary election. “I’m just grateful for the opportunity to continue to serve

the people in my district, and I’m eager to get back to work,” Sen. Brownsberger told The Boston Globe in the wake of his election-recount coup. “I’m a true public servant. I always call issues the way I see them, and I always listen closely to my con-

stituents, and I’m going to be the same person next year that I was last year.” Brownsberger, age 69, triumphed largely due to support

from voters in his hometown of Belmont while 34-year-old Lander won Boston and Watertown, as well as the part of Cambridge located in the district.
